### Recommended De-Worming Schedule

**\*\*When using *Quest*, the horses' weight must be accurate – potential for side effects if overdosed.**

**Annual fecal checks are recommended.** The life cycle of most common worms is 30 days. Based on fecal exams, some older horses may not require as frequent de-worming.

**Program # 1 (Adult horses/minimal exposure to other horses)**

De-worm every 3 months – Ivermectin with Praziquantel for tapeworms once/year, Ivermectin or Quest in the fall and winter for bots.

**Program #2 (Adult horses/moderate exposure to other horses)**

De-worm every 2 months – Ivermectin with Praziquantel for tapeworms once/year, Ivermectin or Quest in the fall and winter for bots.

**Program #3 (Adult horses/high exposure to other horses)**

De-worm once a month, Ivermectin with Praziquantel for tapeworms once/year, Ivermectin or Quest in the fall and winter.

**(Young horses/birth to 2 years)**

(Minimal) de-worm at 2 months, then every other month or

(Maximum) de-worm at 2 months and every 1 month thereafter (to age 2)

**(Horses new to the herd)**

Purge de-worm for 5 days with double dose Panacur, isolate for 14 days.
